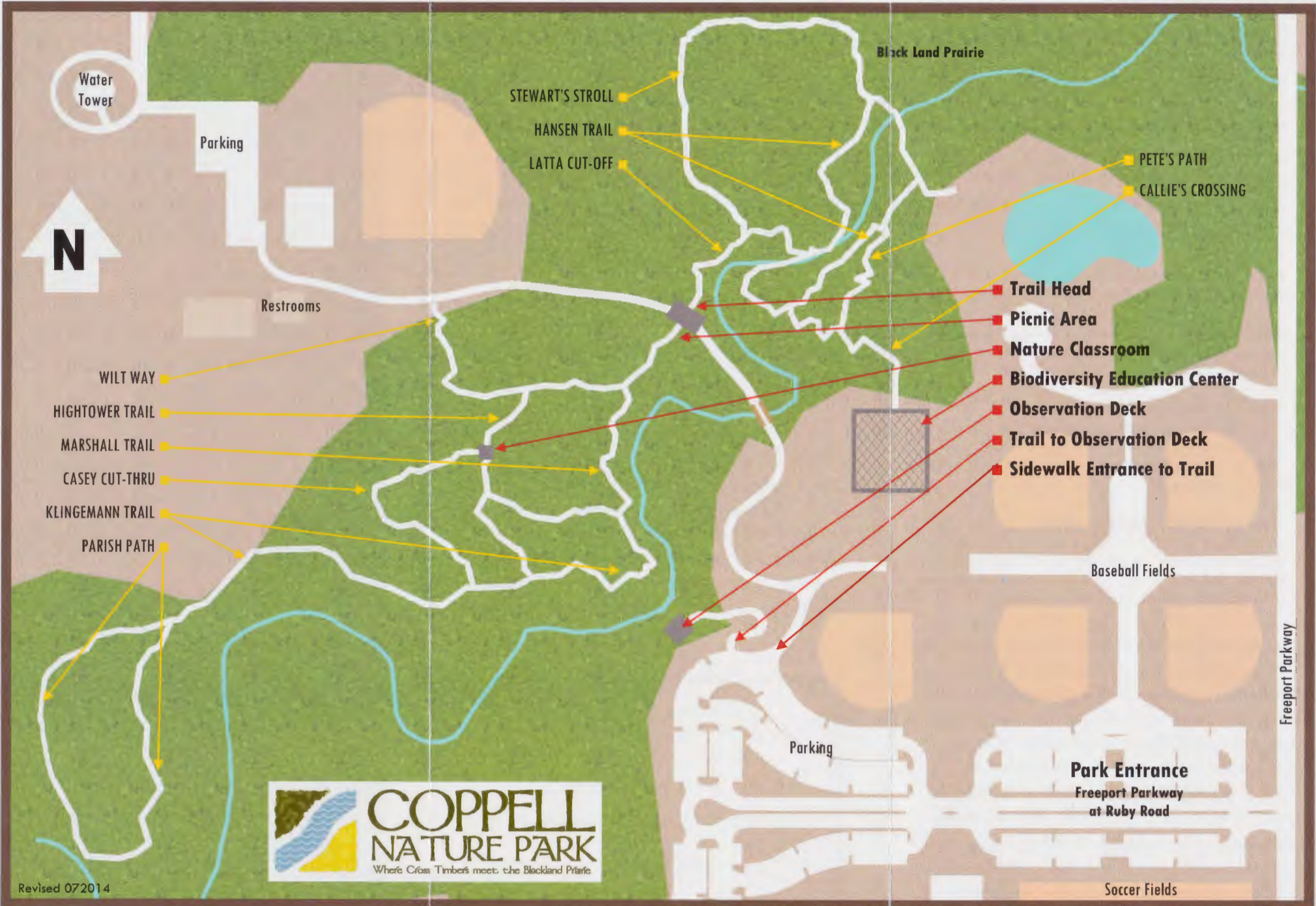


COPPELL NATURE PARK TRAILS MAP

About the Park

Founded in 2006, the Coppell Nature Park was developed and is maintained by local citizen and youth participation to support the Coppell Independent School District's "Service Learning" initiative and the City's focus on a community service partnership with the City and CISD. The park was designed to provide a sanctuary for wildlife, offer learning and service opportunities and afford a peaceful retreat for citizens of Coppell.

Preserve the natural environment

The 63 wooded acre park is home to hawks, coyotes, bobcats, and many other animals. More than 130 different species of birds migrate through the park each year. And, numerous types of native vegetation may be found within the park.

Provide learning opportunities

The nature park provides opportunity for water study, wildlife education, plant identification, nature trails, classroom field trips, geology, chemistry, and earth science.

Make a difference in the community

Hundreds of Coppell citizens and students have been involved with the planning and work in the park. Service and education continue to work hand-in-hand to improve the community's quality of life.

Located on the west side of Coppell within Wagon Wheel Park, the Nature Park may be accessed through the main entrance of Wagon Wheel at Freeport Parkway and Ruby Road. The entrance to the Nature park is located at the far west side of the main parking lot; a sidewalk leads to the clearly marked Trail Head. The 63-acre wooded park, includes walking trails, picnic tables, benches, a creek-side deck, and an outdoor nature classroom-in-the-round.

Biodiversity Education Center

Opened in 2014, the Center provides education programs on conservation and the environment. Its mission is to be a unique, adaptable, sustainable facility that will inspire passion for our local and global environment, promote community involvement, and create life-long learning opportunities by incorporating engaging outdoor activities and innovative technologies that will provide fun, hands-on experiences where people of all ages may explore, learn, share, and celebrate nature.
